



From the Vicar – Happy Easter to you all.

My heartfelt thanks to all those who have worked so hard to make the Church ready to mark the Triduum, and to celebrate the Resurrection, as well as those who have led prayers – said or sung – and those who have prepared candidates for baptism.

All Saints' Font – As many of you will know, the font in the Church has been out of action for several years, because we are unable to confirm the safety of the mechanism which allows the heavy lid to be lifted and raised. I am delighted to say that we have finally received faculty permission to remove the font lid, which will be placed on display in the corner behind the font. A new, less elaborate and much lighter lid will be carved, and we will once more be able to use the font. Please pray that this work can be completed in time for Pentecost (24th May) when we will be hosting a baptism and confirmation with +Will presiding. IF the font lid is not ready in time, this service will still go ahead.

Baptism and Confirmation at Pentecost, 24th May 2026 – We are thrilled that +Will is joining us on Sunday 24th May at 10.00 am for a Mass with Baptism and Confirmations. We hope that he will also be able to rededicate the font as part of the
